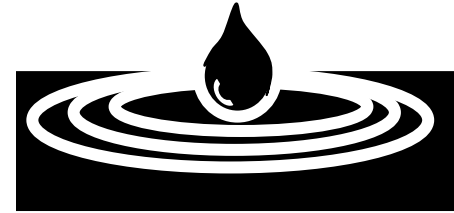

Preliminaries Announcements, chalice lighter, readings, flowers

Completing The Altar (Leader reads) One at a time, please place the flowers you brought onto the altar, inside the circle of stones. As you place your flower, say one thing you brought to this group.

Sitting in Silence

Sharing/Deep Listening Share a story from your time with this group, or thoughts you have on the change that is about to take place.

Communion of Stones (Leader reads)
