- WHEREAS, United States support for the Nicaraguan contras and U. S. mining of Nicaraguan harbors pose the threat of armed U.S. invasion of Nicaragua; and
- WHEREAS, U.S. military aid to El Salvador, coupled with the build p of U.S. armed forces and air bases in neighboring Honduras, foreshadows military action against Salvadoran guerillas; and
- WHEREAS, The Emergency Response Network organized by the American Friends Service Committee invites citizens to pledge opposition to American militarism in Latin America and, by acts of nonviolent civil disobedience and participation in vigils and demonstrations, to prevent or halt further intervention or invasion in Nicaragua and E1 Salvador;
- BE IT RESOLVED, that the First Unitarian Church of San Jose, In concert with other national and local groups and organizations*, affirms its endorsement and support for the work of the Emergency Response Network and calls on its members and others to join in the resistance pledge proposed by the E. R. K,
